TBI Facts – did you know?

Did you know the organization we know as Tau Beta Iota Fraternity did not originally start out with that name? The group was organized in November 1925 as a private social group and had the name TBI Club. After only four months in existence, President Rosier asked the TBI Club to affiliate itself with the school. This was formally agreed to on March 7th 1926, yep Founder's Day. Use of the name TBI Club continued until sometime during the 1928-1929 school year. By that time two other Greek Letter groups had formed and used "Fraternity" in their name. The TBI Club subsequently began to do the same and started using TBI (Tau Beta Iota) Fraternity.

More changes to Scholarships are considered

The administrative changes that had to be made to both the TBI Alumni Scholarship and the TBI Turley Wallman Scholarship saw no increase in the number of applications received. Combined, the TBI Alumni Assoc. has had just over \$13,000 available for awarding over the last 5 years. However the Turley-Wallman has had no applications submitted since 2007, and the Alumni Scholarship had four applications in that same period of time.

Founder's Day Dinner & Memorial Service held

On March 10th 2010, TBI Alumni Association and the Active Chapter of TBI Fraternity marked the 84th anniversary of Tau Beta Iota's founding and remembered our Brother TBI's who have passed away during the last year.

A buffet dinner was held at the Fairmont Field Club, followed by a joint memorial service led by Alumni Association President Chuck Hillberry and Active Chapter Vice President Zack Morton.

The service commemorated the actions of the Founding Members and the Chartering of TBI Fraternity, we memorialized the Brothers of TBI who have died during the past year, and concluded the service with a recapitulation of the initiation ceremony to remind the Brothers present of the values and purpose of our fraternity.

The attendance was not as strong as we had hoped, but there was good fellowship and everyone found the service to be moving and very dignified.

Hopefully we will have a larger turnout next year as this service marks the most important date in the history of our organization. Founder's Day also reminds us of the traditions our fraternity is based upon; and that continuing to practice and pass down these traditions to new TBI's is the foundation which binds us together across the different generations of Brothers.
